National Kidney Month

Data from 2023 estimated that 14% of the American adult population is living with a chronic kidney disease. You only need one functioning kidney to live, but protecting both of your kidneys, if possible, is your best plan of action. Your kidneys play a role in numerous bodily functions. They regulate your fluid levels, activate vitamin D, filter waste from in your blood, control red blood cell production, influence blood pressure, and more.

Colorectal Cancer Month

Only about 70% of adults from age 50 to 75 are current on their colonoscopies. Assuming you have not been told you are in a high-risk group for colon cancer, you should plan to have a colonoscopy every 10 years starting at age 50. The traditional in-clinic colonoscopy is always an option, but in-home testing kits have continued to improve in recent years. If you are not up-to-date on your colonoscopy, schedule an in-clinic visit, or inquire further if an in-home test could be right for you.

The Arizona Department of Economic Security estimates that a brain injury occurs every 9 seconds in the United States. These brain injuries range in severity, and the lasting effects can vary significantly depending on the injury.
