Pastor's Review:

Read: 2 Kings 17:5-17

- Commentary on the history of Israel. Immediate and future application
- The **LORD** gave the moral law of **God**, it is forever.
- **God** is holy and **His** people are holy.
- **God** told in Isaiah that people will do terrible things.
- Rebellion of Judah against **God**. (v.5)
- Background text: Some of the same conduct by believers.
- They refused to do the things **God** said for them to do. Living for themselves and not for the **LORD**.
- (Psa 37:23) The steps of a good man are ordered by the LORD: and he

delighteth in his way.

- Faithlessness of Israelites' kings; disobedience over and over again.

Isa. 30: Rebellious People:

(Isa 30:1) Woe to the rebellious children, saith the LORD, that take counsel, but not of me; and that cover with a covering, but not of my spirit, that they may add sin to sin:

(Isa 30:2) That walk to go down into Egypt, and have not asked at my mouth; to strengthen themselves in the strength of Pharaoh, and to trust in the shadow of Egypt!

- They were depending on foreign nations, not plans from the **LORD**.
- Be wise in all your dealings with others. Be led by **God**.

(Isa 30:8) Now go, write it before them in a table, and note it in a book, that it may be for the time to come for ever and ever:

(Isa 30:9) That this is a rebellious people, lying children, children that will not hear the law of the LORD:

(Isa 30:11) Get you out of the way, turn aside out of the path, cause the Holy One of Israel to cease from before us.

- Prophecy of destruction for future generations.
- They did not obey **God's** law; entered into alliances with other nations.

Isa. 31: The Folly of Not Trusting God:

(Isa 31:1) Woe to them that go down to Egypt for help; and stay on horses, and trust in chariots, because they are many; and in horsemen, because they are very strong; but they look not unto the Holy One of Israel, neither seek the LORD!

- Remember men are men AND NOT **GOD!**

(Isa 31:3) Now the Egyptians are men, and not God; and their horses flesh, and not spirit. When the LORD shall stretch out his hand, both he that helpeth shall fall, and he that is holpen shall fall down, and they all shall fail together.

(Isa 31:5) As birds flying, so will the LORD of hosts defend Jerusalem; defending also he will deliver it; and passing over he will preserve it.

- **God** will punish all of these; the eternal story of **God** (those not turning to **God**)
- **God** will save all those that love **Him**; there are some folks that **He** hates; **God** hates sin....
- (Pro 6:16) These six things doth the LORD hate: yea, seven are an abomination unto him:
- **God** has pronounced judgment; but there is a message of deliverance to the remnant of **God's** people.

Isa. 32: The Reign of Righteousness:

(Isa 32:1) Behold, a king shall reign in righteousness, and princes shall rule in judgment.

(Isa 32:2) And a man shall be as an hiding place from the wind, and a covert from the tempest; as rivers of water in a dry place, as the shadow of a great rock in a weary land.

- This **King, Jesus** will reign in righteousness
- (Joh 4:10) Jesus answered and said unto her, If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water.

(Isa 32:5) The vile person shall be no more called liberal, nor the churl said to be bountiful.

(Isa 32:6) For the vile person will speak villany, and his heart will work iniquity, to practise hypocrisy, and to utter error against the LORD, to make empty the soul of the hungry, and he will cause the drink of the thirsty to fail.

- Recognize foolishness; one who rejects **God** has a detrimental effect.
- Don't practice sinning; believers lie to themselves if they practice sin.
- (Mat 7:22) Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?
- (Mat 7:23) And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.
- The fool that will stand before the people of **God** and what that live outside of that which is unacceptable before **God; His** judgment reigns
- Don't be a fool; practicing iniquity.
- Check if you are receiving nourishment where you get the **Word of God**.
- **God** does not feed us and have us to stay the same size.
- (Mat 5:6) Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.
- The food of the **LORD** causes you to grow in the **Spirit**.
