## **Pastor's Review:**

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## Isaiah

- Isaiah's prophesy about the rebellion of Israel and their punishment for rebellion
- **God's** looks at rebellion against **Him** as an of unbelief; thank **God** for **His** grace and forgiveness.
- Have you really ever forgiven someone?
- The **Lord's** chastising of Israel.
- We ask and have experienced forgiveness from **God**.
- What would you tell someone about how they can forgive someone?
  - Read and study **God's Word**.
  - Realize it hurts you more.
  - **God** removes the hatred.
  - Forgetting is the hard part.
  - Pray for them.
  - Offer them fellowship and **Jesus**.
  - Give them the **Good News of God's** forgiveness.
  - This is significant because...
  - Forgive someone by not holding what they did to you against them;
  - **God** never forgets, **He** knows all about me and you.
- (Mat 6:15) But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.
  - Take your lesson from the **Great Forgiver; His** grace our forgiveness.
- (Rom 5:8) But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.
  - Forgiveness in its fullness can only be experienced when the one who has offended asked for forgiveness.
  - Not holding offense against someone is forgiveness.
  - Who is beyond our redemption?
- (Mar 3:29) But he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost hath never forgiveness, but is in danger of eternal damnation:
  - A heart that cannot forgive is tainted; we have a changed heart.
  - You don't have to come to church to go where you need to go!
  - Love above all things; walk like and talk like **Christ**.

### Review:

- **God's** judgment of Israel; **God** has brought upon them drama for their rebellion; some things come as a part of **God's** chastisement.
- Difference between the wrath of **God** and the chastening of **God**.

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- The wrath of **God** has no mercy; **He** chasten us out of our rebellion.
- **God's** children will not come up under the wrath of **God**. (No mercy!)

(Isa 19:1) The burden of Egypt. Behold, the LORD rideth upon a swift cloud, and shall come into Egypt: and the idols of Egypt shall be moved at his presence, and the heart of Egypt shall melt in the midst of it.

(Isa 19:2) And I will set the Egyptians against the Egyptians: and they shall fight every one against his brother, and every one against his neighbour; city against city, and kingdom against kingdom.

- There is nothing new going on; we need outreach from the church.
- Encourage and show the younger generation as they seek **God**.
- We are experiencing spiritual warfare;

### Chp. 20:

(Isa 20:2) At the same time spake the LORD by Isaiah the son of Amoz, saying, Go and loose the sackcloth from off thy loins, and put off thy shoe from thy foot. And he did so, walking naked and barefoot.

(Isa 20:3) And the LORD said, Like as my servant Isaiah hath walked naked and barefoot three years for a sign and wonder upon Egypt and upon Ethiopia;

(Isa 20:6) And the inhabitant of this isle shall say in that day, Behold, such is our expectation, whither we flee for help to be delivered from the king of Assyria: and how shall we escape?

- Stripped down to undergarments.
- **God** never misses; you might get by but you won't get away.

### Chp. 21:

(Isa 21:1) The burden of the desert of the sea. As whirlwinds in the south pass through; so it cometh from the desert, from a terrible land.

(Isa 21:11) The burden of Dumah. He calleth to me out of Seir, Watchman, what of the night? Watchman, what of the night?

(Isa 21:13) The burden upon Arabia. In the forest in Arabia shall ye lodge, O ye travelling companies of Dedanim.

- The prophet is hearing and seeing is a burden; not good news primarily for Israel.
- They will come under the chastisement of **God**.
- Setting up for the coming of **Christ** our **Savior**.

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- This message for Isaiah, **God's** faithful servant; he is **God's** sign.

## Chp. 22:

(Isa 22:1) The burden of the valley of vision. What aileth thee now, that thou art wholly gone up to the housetops?

(Isa 22:12) And in that day did the Lord GOD of hosts call to weeping, and to mourning, and to baldness, and to girding with sackcloth:

(Isa 22:13) And behold joy and gladness, slaying oxen, and killing sheep, eating flesh, and drinking wine: let us eat and drink; for to morrow we shall die.

- During all this calamity they still did not turn to **God**.
- Weeping and moaning but didn't come to **Him**.
- People using their resources for themselves only.
- We live in the greatest country on the planet but we still don't thank **God** for **His** blessings upon us.
