Pastor's Review:

- **GOD** never brings judgment to wipe out **His** people.
 - Mercy is always there for **His** people.
 - (2Ch 7:14) If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.
 - **God** will not let the adversary have the final laugh.
 - **God** never has judgment without mercy for **His** people.
 - **God** will change those who cause calamity.

- **Chp. 19:1-25 Proclamation Against Egypt:**
 - Where do you go when circumstances get you down?
 - People will go to other things, not to **God** for relief.
 - Pray like you know the **Lord; because you know who God is.**
 - The more you know about **Jesus** the more you know about **God.**
 - OT; **God** isn't just going to save Jews but Gentiles as well.
 - **God's** judgment fighting amongst each other in Egypt.
 - Utter destruction but **God** has sent a **Savior**, not just to the Hebrews, to let the world know **He** has sent a **Savior**.

- Once the gospel was prominent in Egypt.
- **God** smites and heals; **Lord have mercy!**
- What makes **God's** people is a relationship with **Him**.
- The Egyptians and the Syrians all who were enemies **God** determined they too shall be blessed.

- **Chp. 20:1-6 Sign Against Egypt and Ethiopia:**
 - Warning to others who believed Egypt could provide help against their enemies.
 - The coming humiliation and destruction of Egypt.
 - God is the only proper object of the people's trust.

- **Chp. 21:1-17 Fall of Babylon:**
 - These applications have to do with the demise of nations in time.
 - This is the history of the future; a foretelling.
 - This graphic image of a woman in labor; of pain and distress.
 - The prophet Isaiah confirmed that the destruction of Babylon had been announced by none other than God Himself.

- **Chp. 22:1-25 Proclamation Against Jerusalem:**
 - Read 1Kings 7;10 (for additional insight)
 - (1Co 15:32) If after the manner of men I have fought with beasts at Ephesus, what advantageth it me, if the dead rise not? let us eat and drink; for tomorrow we die.
 - Not a sentiment for those who have faith in **God**.
 - We are a blessed country, slapping **God** in the face.
 - Too many churches are not examples of righteous living.
 - Our families do not live according to **God's** standards.
 - Take note of where we are as a country, how we are living against **God**.
 - Rebellion against **God**.
