Study in the Gospel of Luke

Introduction/Review:

- Chp. 3:
 - John the Baptizer and Jesus Christ are fulfilling their respective roles in the plan of salvation. (v.1-20)
 - \circ Jesus is baptized by John the Baptizer. (v.21-22)
 - Genealogy of Jesus Christ: (v.23-38)
 - Jesus' lineage is traced back to Adam, emphasizing His relation to humankind.
 - Luke records the family tree of Mary, purpose of sharing Jesus' legitimacy to the throne of David although Joseph was also of the family of David, he was not Jesus' father, God was Jesus' Father. (v.31-33)
- Chp. 4:

Study in the Gospel of Luke



- Jesus led by the Spirit to the wilderness for forty days was tempted by Satan, ordained by God. (v.1-2)
- There are opportunities day and night of temptation for us to turn away from God.
- Carefully search the Scripture for yourself not allowing false teachings to take root. (v.3-13; Ps. 91:11,12)
- Get a fuller understanding of the Scripture, knowing when it is taken out of context.
- Temptation of Christ came from the adversary; we are being tested by the devil by what is in us.
- o God is our Source for being victorious. (Job 13:15; Dan. 3)
- Situations come to see if you will deal with them by yourself or with the Holy Spirit.
- (Luk 4:13) And when the devil had ended all the temptation, he departed from him for a season.
- There is nothing good in the world but GOD! (1 Jn. 4:8,16;
 Jas. 1:13; 1 Cor. 3:1-4)
- Jesus went to church because that was His custom; He read the Bible. (v.14-19)
- Jesus stopped reading in the middle of verse 2 because it refers to the second coming of Christ and His judgment; He preached the "good news"....today is the day of salvation. (v.18-19; Ps. 61:1-2)
- (Luk 4:24) And he said, Verily I say unto you, No prophet is accepted in his own country. (v.3-30)
- (Luk 4:37) And the fame of him went out into every place of the country round about. (v.31-37)
- Jesus speaks to the Peter's mother-in-law sickness. (v.38-39)
- He speaks to the wind and to the storms. (Mt. 8:23-27; Lk. 8:22-25)
- By faith do what our Savior did out of the authority He has;
 according to His will. (Jas. 5:16)
- When we pray have in mind that God is able and His will be manifested. (1 Jn. 5:14-15; 1 Cor. 10:31)
