(John 8:32) And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

(Matthew 11:29) Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls.

Study in the Gospel of Luke

Review:

- Jesus calls His first disciples, Peter, John and James his brother; to follow Him. (5:1-11; Mt. 4:18-22)
- Jesus responds to and cleanses a leper, symptom of sin and to show his healing to the priest. (v.12-14)
- Jesus was rejected as the Messiah because of political and peer pressure.
- Jesus' early ministry publicly and privately; He often sought out places where He could pray. (v.15-16)
- Many knew that Jesus was who He said He was. (Jn. 3:1-21)
- Jesus heals and forgives a paralytic as his friends reflects strong faith. (v.17-26)

Chp. 5:

Matthew Tax Collector: (v.27-32)

- Jesus' chooses Levi/Matthew and said to him "follow Me!" You will not follow unless you are called. (v.27-28)
- Jesus called and had dinner with the tax collectors, considered hated by the masses. (v.29-30)
- (Luk 5:31) And Jesus answering said unto them, They that are whole need not a physician; but they that are sick.
- Just being with Christians and not in the company of those not saved, you are the gospel to them, it's a problem.
- Who will you witness to, being holy yourself? Does God hear sinners? Yes, He does.
- Jesus is the Great Physician; He had higher regard for the sick and sinners. (v.31-32)
- Who are the righteous? (Rm. 3:10-12; 2 Pt. 3:9; Jn. 3:16)

Jesus is Questioned about Fasting: (v.33-39)

- Prayer and fasting out of tradition, Jesus said there are times for rejoicing but the time to fast will come. (v.33-35)
- Jesus speaks His first parable here; new wine in old wineskins won't work, it doesn't match. (v.36-39)
- New wine (Jesus' gospel message), old wineskins (traditions, fermented and aged). (v.37-38)
- (2Co 5:17) Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.
- Tithing is OT; give under old covenant or born-again gospel giving; you can't send up praises without first being blessed. Praise because of how good God is!
- Old Covenant was a school master, preparation for every day being new in Christ Jesus; can't be accomplished in and of yourself (opposite of self-righteousness).
- In your giving, give like the Holy Ghost is in you, sharing the Kingdom of God with the lost. (Mt. 28:19)

Chp. 6:

Jesus is Lord of the Sabbath: v.1-5

- Jesus said there are exceptions even to important religious standards. (v.1-5; 1 Sam. 21:1-6)
- Jesus, the Messiah was the same Lord who instituted Sabbath regulations.
- Bring all your traditions under holy submission, walk in the newness of Christ and who you are in God. (v.3-4)
- God would want you to be obedient to His Word.
- (Luk 6:5) And He said unto them, That the Son of Man is Lord also of the Sabbath.
- **Obedience is better than sacrifice! (1 Sam. 15:22)**
- (Mat 22:37) Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.
- **Jesus has full authority to make exceptions..... (v.5)**
